PRESENTATION AT ROLAND GARROS

The 1995 World Wheelchair Tennis Champions, Monique Kalkman and David Hall were officially invited to receive their well deserved Awards at the Roland Garros tournament in Paris.

Thirty-one year old Monique Kalkman is married to her coach Marc Kalkman and resides in Diemen, The Netherlands. Monique has played wheelchair tennis from the age of fourteen and has received the World Champion title since 1992. In 1995, Monique won seven titles including the two Super Series Championships; The British Open and US Open, along with the Southern Regional

Championships, USTA Outdoors, Austrian Open, Swiss Open and NEC Wheelchair Tennis Masters.

Australian born David Hall, now lives in California, USA. At twenty-five, David has played wheelchair tennis for the past six years and he also won both the Super Series Championships in 1995. At the US Open in one fell swoop he won the men's singles, doubles and mixed titles to become ranked No 1 for the first time. David has also conquered the Japan Open, Australian Open and Sydney Summer Open to add to his collection. This is the first time David has received this prestigious trophy.
